1. REMOVE GLASS FROM 4X6" PHOTO FRAME
2. INSERT 4X6" CHRISTMAS PAPER INTO FRAME
3. GLUE A MINI CLOTHESPIN TO CHRISTMAS PAPER  
(OR USE A THUMB TACK)
4. CUT CARDS APART WITH SCISSORS OR PAPER CUTTER
5. STORE CARDS IN A SMALL BAG ON BACK OF FRAME
6. CLIP CARD WITH NUMBER OF DAYS REMAINING UNTIL  
CHRISTMAS TO THE CLOTHESPIN
7. CHANGE CARD DAILY TO COUNT DOWN TO CHRISTMAS!
